Prioritize and Divide Options

- Options will be posted online
- Teams will be formed among options 1, 2, and 3
- OPTIONS:
 - 1. Re-engineer the selection process- Automate the way they do it now and reengineer the process to be more efficient for everyone
 - Make prices more visible to faculty during selection process
 - Coordinate choices over section/time
 - Make it easier for faculty to adopt open access materials
 - CSU or Merlot like website: Bookstore, IT, or Provost web site, Library
 - CSU has more capabilities than Merlot
 - Put all selected faculty-facing pieces online in one place: UNM Wide
 - Encourage a la carte
 - Encourage faculty to develop own materials

- Track materials costs
- 2. Pilot alternative purchasing options
 - Publisher deals for all student first day access- might not make sense for all courses
 - Currently being piloted with Pearson and Cengage for biology 238 and MGMT 310
 - Embed materials cost- requires cost increase
 - Amazon or similar deal- might cause damage to bookstore
 - Pay attention to how amazon will innovate to see if they present a new option (web services)
- o 3. Student education campaign
- Option 1 is a mess that needs more definition.
- Option 2 would require that there would be a tuition/fee increase

New Business
